Empowering Teachers to Address Environmental Issues Without Stressing Students!

As educators, how do you approach the subject of the environment in a way that reduces student anxiety and inspires action? Gould League's General Manager Anne-Maree McInerney, a renowned global sustainability advisor, will be leading a day-long immersion into the forest alongside other experts in forest and water conservation. This PD promises to uplift and inspire teachers as they discover innovative policies and practices that tackle some of humanity's most pressing environmental challenges.

We will share a new take on the value of eco-system services such as crop pollination, water purification, flood protection, and carbon sequestration that are worth trillions of dollars globally, give an insight into adaptations of local wildlife, the history of eco-system services of the Yarra Ranges catchment area and the impact of humans.

We will also introduce Teachers to the game changing yet little known concept of "The Blue Economy", which involves adopting a circular economy model that drives systemic change and zero waste. It has the potential to promote sustainable growth and productivity across all segments of society, with innovations that address environmental issues that will create the jobs of tomorrow.

The day celebrates the tall trees of the Toolangi Forest and the river system that nurtures us and provides Melbourne's water supply and new innovative practical solutions to the many challenges facing society, such as failing ecosystems, species extinction, food security, waste management, and climate change. This innovative approach to real-world learning offers a glimpse into the future of education, building resilience, creating jobs, and contributing positively to society and the environment.

Global challenges and solutions (inspired by nature) to some of our most wicked problems

This session Introduces the Blue Economy (a physics approach to sustainable development); Forests and their role in Sustainable Development; Important and gratifying changes to Earth Science Curriculum; Waves of Innovation; Biomimicry specifically Regenerative Farming, Biophilia and Living Filters; 30 by 30 and Half Earth; and the importance of Nature and Outdoor learning to address eco-anxiety.

Overview of Ecosystems Services of the Upper Ranges catchment area



First-hand experience of Toolangi State Forest and it's Ecosystem Services

This session entails a 2.2km loop walk to the Yea River (gentle grade – easy to walk). See the world's tallest flowering plant (Mountain Ash), Messmate, Tree Ferns and other wonders of the forest. We test water turbidity, salinity and temperature, discuss local food production, and how Toolangi's forests contribute to creating, collecting, storing and filtering water, as well as an exploration of human influences on water movement and quality.

Innovation by Nature - it's worth more than you realise!

This session not only gives an economic value to nature and the ecosystem services it provides, it showcases a range of biomemetic and blue economy innovation that's reducing waste, increasing yields in agriculture and aquaculture, how we can now make paper with out trees using the waste of mining processes, get inspiration from termite mounds to provide air-conditioning without the need for power, lighting via luminescence and much more.



Learn new skills

Toolangi State Forest is the perfect outdoor learning space to learn new skills. Discover:

- The animals of the forest and how they are adapting to survive and thrive
- How to measure carbon in a tree
- How to measure and assess fuel hazards in the forest
- How to undertake plant transects to measure change over time, biodiversity



The importance of nature and outdoor learning

This short final session back at the CFA, we answer any questions from the day, allow teachers to share innovation or activities that is working well in the classroom as well as provide an overview of all Gould Forest Programs and how we link them to learning outcomes of the Victorian Curriculum so students and teachers alike can and benefit from nature and outdoor learning.
