FREE TEACHER PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT DAY focusing on how to introduce young learners to the Circular Economy and connecting to nature.

Introducing early learners to invertebrates is a great way to lay the foundation for understanding the basics of the Circular Economy. Invertebrates, such as worms, insects, and other small creatures, play vital roles in ecosystems by decomposing organic matter, recycling nutrients, and supporting plant growth. Teaching young students about these creatures helps them grasp how nature's processes are interconnected, much like the principles of a circular economy, where resources are reused and waste is minimised. By observing invertebrates in action, early learners can begin to appreciate the balance and sustainability inherent in natural systems, fostering a deeper awareness of how human activities can work in harmony with the environment.

In this program we will work towards removing phobias and stigmas around invertebrates so we can focus more on the incredible roles they play in being natures recyclers and how they can play an important role in reducing human waste and inspiring us with new ideas.






This learning program is best suited to 3 and 4 Year Old Kinder educators and child care staff, and co-ordinators of incursions/ excursions.
